BASIC MEMS BADGE:

The new requirements went into effect 01January2011 and therefore will apply to any members of Co. D that had not submitted paper work prior to that date. The following IS courses are required for BASIC MEMS; IS-100, IS-102, IS-200, IS-700, IS-701, IS-775 and IS-800. These courses are required in addition to a Practicum consisting of a write up on an actual exercise and a table top exercise. SAGUS (State Guard Association of the US) membership is required.



HISTORY CORNER:

Thanks to Sgt. Munday for pointing out my error in the January history corner. The photo I choose to illustrate the MSTs deployment for the riots in Detroit in July of 1943 actually showed Federal troops who arrived on the scene afterwards. An accurate photo (shown here) correctly portrays Mich State Troops in Detroit during their deployment. The difference is MST forces were not issued the M1 or the earlier M1917A1 helmet

but used a unique design similar to construction helmets of the time. Also, the MST had to give up their rifles to the war effort so were armed with 12 gage shotguns. Thanks to Sgt. Munday and PFC Naud for giving a talk on the history of the Michigan State Troops and

for bringing artifacts identified to the MST to educate the 2 Bn on the history of our unit. Future editions of the DELTA DIGEST will feature more photos of artifacts from the collection for those who missed the talk.
